Kolmini Pharmacy Station will become the Fourth Hope Alive! Clinic

Dr. Einstein: “I am constantly visited by pigs (and chickens). Sick people waiting to see me must sit on a tree. I have no place to put my medical bag or medicine. When it rains I get completely wet.” Think about your doctor’s office. Then try to picture Clinic Day in Kolmini. Thanksgiving time 2005 was Grand Opening for Parent Clinic, the third clinic. Who would have guessed less than one year later God would tug on our hearts to begin another building project? We will keep you updated as Kolmini Clinic unfolds. (See Dr. Einstein on page 2.)

Kolmini is a dry, barren land. As you may remember, we dug a well there that provides clean water for their animals and sanitation. But the water is salty, so they must walk 2½ hours for water to drink (dirty). Please pray we can provide potable water in Kolmini. So far in 2006 we have raised \$2,225 for a desalination or filtration project.

Mom-Tot - Babies will receive vaccinations against dangerous diseases this month. Free of charge, mothers and children receive food, doctor visits, medicine, and moms receive child-rearing education (and of course, the Gospel). Malnutrition and hunger is a huge problem in Haiti (only second to the need for Jesus). Thank you, Mom-Tot sponsors; you’re changing Haiti one mother and baby at a time. Lots more mothers and babies need sponsors for **only \$25/month.**

Pharmacy Station Partners – Everybody knows food and medicine are essential to good health. But in Haiti, most people don’t have much of either one. Very few people in Haiti have a refrigerator, a pantry with food, or a bottle of Tylenol for a headache or fever. For **only \$10 a month**, you can make a difference by providing food and medicine in areas of Haiti where no other medical care is available. Please consider partnering with a pharmacy station.

Laboratory Equipment for Mariani and Tricon Clinics – Often proper disease diagnosis is difficult to make without lab testing. Lab equipment has been purchased and has arrived ready for shipment to Haiti. **Thank you** for your faithful support!
